

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

Study support



Work options while you study

You may be eligible to work up to **20 hours a week** and full-time during holidays.

Minimum wage is NZD\$18.90 per hour from 1 April 2020.



When you graduate two or three years stayback

You may be eligible to apply for a two or three year post-study work visa.

You may be eligible to apply:

- Level 7 Bachelor's degree or higher 3 year post-study work visa.
- Graduate Diploma or another Level 7 qualification 2 year post-study work visa
- Level 4, 5 or 6 2 year post-study work visa

Criteria Includes:

- Studying outside Auckland
- Successfully completing your qualification(s) by 31 December 2021

If you complete your qualification after 31 December 2021, the length of your visa will be the same as for people who studied in Auckland.

Employment and internships

Building on the strong relationships between WITT and local businesses, our WITT Industry Placement & Employment Coordinator Jo Syme helps students make an impact in Taranaki workplaces.

Jo liaises with businesses in the region, connecting them with students for industry placements and part-time work.

Students in WITT's Bachelor of Applied Management and Graduate Diploma programmes complete 200 to 400 hours unpaid placements in local businesses, where they work in an area associated with their area of specialisation and also undertake an indepth project on a relevant organisational problem or issue.

Here are some of the organisations who have recently offered internship projects to WITT students. Note: this is to give potential students an idea of the industries they MAY be able to work with.

Note 2 IELTS scores used must be taken from a single IELTS Test Report Form (i.e. combining scores from more than one test is not permissible).

Note 3 New versions of some NZCEL qualifications, and in some cases new qualifications, were published on 13 June 2017. These are intended to replace pre-existing versions and qualifications, which have been given expiring status until discontinued on 31 December 2019.

Homestay costs do not include personal items such as toothpaste, shampoo and toiletries. The costs of telephone calls to overseas countries are the responsibility of the student and arrangements must be made with the host families for all toll calls.

Private rental (flatting)

Live independently by renting an apartment or share a house with others.

- Have your own room or share with other students. Flats are usually unfurnished. Bathroom and kitchen facilities are shared.
- Rent is paid per room with all other expenses (food, power, telephone and internet) along with cooking and cleaning shared.
- If you choose this type of accommodation, you will need to find your own rental property. International Registration Fee

One-off Registration Fee: NZD\$250.

Textbooks and associated materials are additional to the tuition fee and are an estimate only.

New Plymouth Airport pickup FREE (Subject to at least 3 working days notice of arrival details).

Homestay application fee: NZD\$150.

International Medical Insurance

Travel and medical insurance is compulsory for international students studying in New Zealand. A provision for the premium for travel and medical insurance will be included within your Offer of a Place. Insurance must be from the period of your enrolment until the expiry of the Student Visa, unless departing New Zealand earlier.

Photocopying & Printing

You will be issued with a student ID card after enrolment. You have the option of being able to credit your card with money for photocopying, and printing. Photocopiers are located around the campus.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

RPL recognises that you may have learned from previous experiences such as:

- Formal courses and qualifications
- On-the-job training
- Work experience
- Life experience/learning
- Self-instruction/informal

You should lodge your application for RPL when you arrive in New Zealand, with the department concerned before your course starts. Please note that you will be required to pay a fee to registry when you apply for RPL, except for cross credits.

Essential information

Accident Insurance

The Accident Compensation Corporation provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents, and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. Further information can be viewed on the ACC website at www.acc.co.nz

Eligibility for Health Services

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full cost of that treatment.

Full details on entitlements to publicly funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health, and can be viewed on their website at www.health.govt.nz

Medical and Travel Insurance

International students (including group students) must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while in New Zealand.

Refunds

It is important that you read WITT's Refund Policy contained in the International Enrolment form. There is no right to a refund of fees if you change your mind about studying at WITT.

Visas and Immigration

Immigration New Zealand currently require a student to have evidence of NZ\$15,000 to cover living expenses for each year of study, or \$1,250 per month, plus a return ticket to their home country.
